Date: January 6, 2012

The Florida Department of Financial Services has decided to implement some new changes that directly affect you as a title agent and/or agency.

Starting on January 18th, 2012, if a licensee/appointee has an invalid address on file with the Department, then no appointing entity will be able to renew the licensee's appointment. The addresses include email, home, business and mailing. When the licensee updates their addresses in their MyProfile account, then the licensee will be able to have their appointment(s) renewed.

(According to statute 626.551, you are required to notify the department within 60 days after a change of name, residence address, principal business street address, mailing address, contact telephone numbers, or e-mail address. Failure to notify the department within the required time period could result in a fine not to exceed \$250 for the first offense and, for subsequent offenses, a fine of at least \$500 or suspension or revocation of the license pursuant to s. 626.611 or s. 626-621.)

Starting the end of January, 2012, Old Republic National Title Insurance Company will be contacting you if your email address requires updating and we are unable to renew your agent or agency license.
